

## Widaloo Frene me come





#### Fishing Area:



North of the bay is sandy, with bays and rock ledges. The BAY itself is big and protected from the elements, with lots of baitfish and good fish.

The south area is a big long flat rock ledge, broken up in a few places. The fishing in this area can be very good. These sections are deep with some sections devoid of rocks.




#### Tackle Requirements:

- \* Any size rod, depending on the species targeted on.
- \* Any recl (if targeting gamefish, the reel must have a rim, be balanced and have 250m of backing)
- \* Intermediate line
- \* Quick sinking line
- \* Stripping basket
- \* Rock shoes
- \* Light shock tippet (81b)
- \* Heavy shock tippet (30lb)
- \* Flies Big deceiver, shrimps, seafice, poppers, minnows, squid, halfbeaks, clousers

Targeted Species: Kingfish, shal, queenfish, halfbeak, stonebream, blacktoff, threadfin mirrorfish, wayle garrick, smelt, queen mackerel, bonefish???, pompano???, garrick.



## The Complete Guide to Widal

#### General:

The winds should be North eastly, hopefully not very strong. As can be seen from the rough drawing, there is plenty of places to fish. If the South West blows, no problem as there is plenty of places to fish.

In order to fish Cape Vidal effectively one has to be able to cast at least 10 meters. If you cant cast this far then .... I do not know, sit with Steve and watch others eatch the fish.

#### Rock Fishing:

Normally done about 3 hours after high tide to about 4 hours before high. This is when fly anglers can fish into some good deep water for Kingfish, Shad, Garrick, Queen mackerel and Queen fish. Here we use intermediate type lines and Big flies, such as Big Deceivers, Poppers, Minnows Halfbeaks and Clousers.

#### Beach Fishing:

Here we can wade the banks of the bays casting into the surf zone using sinking lines and small flies such as Shrimps, Sealice and Squid.

Main fish targeted is Smelt, Wave garrick, Threadfin mullet, BONEFISH & POMPANO.

#### Funfishing:

Here we target Stonebream, Kitefish, Blacktail & Halfbeaks. Fishing around rocks and into gullies, using floating and intermediate lines. Flies are small Shrimps, Sealice. Squid and Minnows.

Vidal must have the most potential for big fish, as well as bunches of different species.

Don't forget to carry plenty food stuffs and bread as the shop there does not provide too well. Also, don't rely on catching fish for food, because if the wind is blowing too hard, then you will starve. The facilities in the camp are comfortable, with hot and cold water showers, flushable toilets and plenty running water. As a last note, remember that the gates open at 6h00 and close at 21h00 (get confirmation of this from Howard). See you there and
