<u>Attached</u> are a series of maps prepared by Richard Viljoen for TSA and FOSAF. I have enclosed the EC map as well because the KZN chaps may be able to speak more knowledgeably to what is just across the border than the chaps in PE.

The first two maps show where TSA and FOSAF say trout occur and are numbered by sub quaternary catchment. The second set doesn't have the sub quaternary catchment areas but show (in hatched red or orange) where DEA allege trout do not occur. If this does not complicate things enough you can access the DEA map at this link.

The DEA map only shows where DEA says trout could occur but do not occur according to them. These areas are the areas that are mapped in orange / red on the TSA/FOSAF map. It is a bit of a juggle to work around these maps.

I find that the DEA online map is useful as you can search by certain landmarks and even farm Surveyor General numbers. This takes you to where you want to be fairly quickly and if you know the farm number will tell you if you are in or out fairly fast. The sub quaternary number will take you to the corresponding area on the TSA FOSAF maps or you can locate by google maps. Alternatively you can use the TSA/FOSAF maps as a base and work the other way. I do both.
