CHAIRMAN'S CHIRP

It has been an interesting year. The worst drought since the early 1980's has had a predictable impact on the quality of our fishing especially trout fishing. The rand is losing value against other currencies which together with negative growth is impacting significantly on disposable income. The threat junk status and increasingly violent unrest looms. Nativist ideology, much loved by our environmental authorities, has invaded the thinking and values of the western world resulting in significant political shifts to the right and a concomitant increase in the levels of racial and cultural tension. Our club chairman resigned.



These can all be seen as cause for doom and gloom or as a wakeup call to get off our collective arses and do something about it. Your committee has chosen to go for a high road option. This is in line with a lot of other fly tyers and anglers who are coming up with new ideas on how to respond proactively to the challenges that



lie ahead. We see this in many ways. Gordon Van Der Spuy's annual fly fishing festival is one. Terry Andrew's <u>Trout Talk</u> and other Facebook sites is another as is S J Roberts' Fly Tying South Africa.

Less well known is the increasing interest around developing more sustainable stocking policies that will see more cock fish being introduced and less hen fish bred for food production. On the official front we see increased confidence and cohesion in the kick back against the neo fascist pseudoscience based policies of South Africa's environmental authorities both from civil society and our courts.

We also see the beginnings of networks aimed at reducing the high cost of acquiring fly fishing materials. I do not criticise our wholesalers and retailers who are providing a great service in difficult conditions but paying nearly 70 bucks for a small packet of strung marabou is absurd. The cost phytosanitary controls and the weak rand coupled with the sort of margins that are required to justify the importation of natural fly tying material have all contributed to what are now exorbitant prices. We can bemoan that or use the high prices as an opportunity to create a locally sourced market. So who can offer a locally sourced marabou, cdc, goose biots, duck wing feathers, pheasant tail, mallard flank, francolin, starling, klipspringer, squirrel tail, hares masks and the like?

Next year is unlikely to be easy but it will be exciting.

So enjoy the festive season and let's start the New Year determined to have fun.
