

Guide II 10', 5wt



I have always been a fan of the guide 2 fly rods sold by Xplorer though I have never owned one until now, that is. Christmas came and I thought I deserved a present so off I went and purchased the 10' 5 wt. I like longer rod, especially when fishing off a float tube. The added length also makes it easier to get a fishes head out of the water and thus bring it to net faster. I have a 10' Tim Rajeff Echo 2 but was looking for something a little less brutal. Oh there was also the matter of an upcoming fishing trip and the fact that my much loved and

abused Stealth Red was out of action.

I must say I was delighted with the Guide II. It was everything I hoped it to be and a lot more. Casting was effortless even after a long day on the water. The rod is also very forgiving making it easier for average casters like myself to look good.

I have a Sage VXP 9' and can honestly say that given a choice the Guide ii will come out of the tube first. I do not think there is any rod sold in RSA that beats it on price/action and it competes well with a lot of much more expensive rods.

I have one niggle, and this is not a criticism because R2 300.00 a rod means they are going to be compromises somewhere, and that is the quality of the eyes. They tend to deform and according to one Facebook post, can even break. I would have happily paid a couple of hundred bucks more for better ironmongery. I may even strip the Stuffit was sold with and wrap on my own.

John Geils took offence at this assuring me that standard industry eyes are used. As I said this is not a criticism. The rod is well priced for what it is. I just wonder if a great rod cannot be made superb by this little improvement.
