


The Washington Post's Mensa Invitational once again invited readers to take any word from the dictionary, alter it by adding, subtracting, or changing one letter, and supply a new definition.

# Fly Tying and Other Tips

## The Sawyer's Pheasant Tail Nymph



There are two iconic nymph patterns in the world today. The first and by far the oldest is the GHRE or the Gold Ribbed Hares Ear. The second, a much more recent invention is Frank Sawyer's Pheasant Tail Nymph or simply the Sawyers Nymph. The Sawyers Nymph is truly remarkable both in the simplicity of its original construction

and the huge range of varieties that have evolved from the original fly. Such variations now make up a significant proportion of any fly box the world over. This is a remarkable testament to the quality both of Frank Sawyer as an innovator and of the suitability of the barbs of the tail feather of a cock pheasant as a fly tying material. Another remarkable feature of this fly is how often the original pattern is incorrectly reproduced. It is not as if the pattern is a secret. As Tom Sutcliffe pointed out back in 2011 in the article Tying the original Frank Sawyer pattern, explicit instructions are to be found on pages 56 and 57 of Frank Sawyer's Nymphs and the Trout. More recently Johan Klingberg has produced an excellent video in which he demonstrates how to tie all of Frank Sawyers great flies. It also features some beautiful footage of fishing a tributary of the Test with author of Nymph Fishing, A History of The Art and Practice, Terry Lawton. It is well worth watching. #### **More On The Nymph**

When someone starts a discussion on nymph fishing with "I don't want to sound snobbish...but" you can be sure that you are in the company of a dry fly man which in this country means that you are more than likely with someone from the Western Cape. They fish dry in that part of the world because their rivers are empty. You can't nymph in the Western Cape because the water isn't deep enough so as we are all won't to do; a tragedy is converted into a virtue. So it should come as no surprise that the latest critical look at the gentle art of deep water nymphing is written by a bloke from the Western Cape. It's a thoughtful article nonetheless that does make the point that it is easier to learn how to manage drift and presentation when you can see the bloody fly. In that sense dry fly fishing has a place in teaching fly fishers how to drift. However I remain of the view that fishing only dry is like going to a restaurant and sticking to the starter. There is so much more to be had unless the pickings are thin as in the Western Cape. Still Tim Rolston's article is worth reading. It can be found on the fly loops website by clicking here.


#### Nyala Pans June 2014

## **Tiemco Aero Wing**



Tom Sutcliffe wrote this stuff up in his e mail a couple of weeks back (8 and 16 June) and I was intrigued. It's a closed cell hollow fibre supplied by the Japanese hook manufacturer Tiemco for making parachute posts. The idea is to make the post itself buoyant and visible and though I have not tried it yet those who have says it works like a charm. Tom advised that Frontier stocked it so on my last trip to Sodom; I stopped by to see what they had. I found a shop in the process of moving into larger premises. Frontier, like Complete Angler in Kloof, has taken the shop next to them and will be nearly doubling in size. Happily the shop is still operational so I was able to pick up some Areo Wing from what I am told is a rapidly diminishing stock. A good word from Tom is often as good as money in the bank. It's not cheap at about R75.00 a packet but happily you use very little. It comes in a large range of colours but given the cost I only got one packet. I have tied a couple of flies and I like the result. So much so that I think it will work just as well as a wing material for those spent spinners that Peter Brig ties. So I will be stopping by Frontier for some more in less gaudy colours.
