THE MONTHLY TIE

The Crease Fly by Arno Van Der Nest



Recipe

Hook: Mustad 34007-SS Size 2 Thread: 140 Denier in white Tail: SF flash blend /UV flashaboo (thin) Body: Foam covered in holographic film Body finish: Solarez thin hard or Loon Thin UV clear fly finish and UV torch Other: Permanent markers/eyes

Steps:

Wrap hook shank with thread,
Tie in first layer of tail,
Add UV flashaboo on top of shank,
Add top layer of SF flash blend in a colour of your choice
Apply a thin coat of superglue to thread behind eye of hook.
Secure foam head over hook and ensure bottom is flat.
Add eyes and colour body to suit.
Apply a thin coat of UV resin over body.

Where to fish:

Estuaries, dams and lakes How to fish the fly: Fish the fly on a floating line with a long leader with sharp erratic strips.

NEMBA Update - November 2017

DEA's silence has been deafening. There has not been a peep out of the department since Dr Preston wrote in June this year advising that DEA was reneging on the agreement that trout would not be listed as invasive outside certain nature reserves where they already occur.

Trout SA and FOSAF have been busy. They have escalated this act of bad faith in terms of the Phakisa process. A copy of their letter can be read by clicking <u>here</u>.


